

Gale Stockwell

Gale W. Stockwell (1907-1983) was an artist hired in 1933 to make a painting of downtown Parkville. The resulting painting spent many years in The White House in Washington, DC, returning to Parkville in 1973. The Parkville Frame Gallery is the only retail business in the metro area licensed to sell prints of this iconic painting.

Winslow Homer (1836–1910) is regarded by many as the greatest American painter of the nineteenth century. In this video a number of oil and watercolor paintings created by Homer are reviewed by curators in the Metropolitan Museum of Art (the MET) in New York City. We have reproductions of some of Homer's paintings, and can obtain reproductions of most of the paintings shown in this video.

The Young Shepherdess: William-Adolphe Bouguereau

William-Adolphe Bouguereau (1825-1905) was a French academic painter. In his realistic genre paintings he used mythological themes, making modern interpretations of classical subjects, with an emphasis on the female human body. During Bouguereau's life he enjoyed significant popularity in France and the United States, was given numerous official honors, and received top prices for his work.

The painting *The Young Shepherdess* depicts a young woman tending to her flock of sheep as she looks back to the viewer with some curiosity. It calls to mind a simpler life from much simpler times, a time free from the worries of modern urban life.

Alphonse Mucha

Alfons Maria Mucha (1860–1939) known internationally as Alphonse Mucha, was a Czech painter, illustrator, and graphic artist. He lived in Paris during the Art Nouveau period, and is best known for his distinctly stylized and decorative theatrical posters, particularly those of Sarah Bernhardt.



Mucha's work frequently featured beautiful young women in flowing vaguely Neoclassical looking robes, often surrounded by lush flowers that sometimes formed haloes behind the women's heads. Note: See
